



20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Sometimes a given instruction can backfire if misapplied. "Don't bother reading the manual" said to the owner of a new car can cause him or her to lose out on a built-in safety feature of their new "ride." "Don't worry about punctuation" told to a law student writing a paper might well cause the writer's grade to drop rather quickly from "A" to "C". "Don't take no for an answer" is the worst advice to give a job seeker dependent on a humble self-presentation.

Evidently, however, that kind of slipshod thinking never entered the mind of the unnamed Canaanite mother, the hero in our Gospel story today. She wanted Jesus" help to end her daughter's misery. So she asked, and was not put off by Our Lord's apparent dismissal of her.

She didn't care about all the negative impressions she gave other people, especially the prejudiced people around Jesus at the time. "Go ahead, label me "an unclean Gentile." I don't care. I want to ask for Jesus' help because I believe in His ability to heal my daughter.

When she did get Our Lord's powerful rebuke about not feeding dogs, she responds with the truth about dogs eating table scraps from their master's table. Our Lord was at first stunned a bit, but He guickly realized how great was her faith.

After I get over my shock at the woman's strong retort, I have to admire her for the same reason Jesus did: Her belief in Him. Try as I might to love, honor and obey Our Lord Jesus Christ, I often fail. I want, on the one hand, to be loyal to Him as my Lord and Savior. But on the other hand, like St. Paul, I go and do the exact opposite when a strong temptation comes along. I could claim being hounded by the devil as the poor woman's daughter was. But that's hypocritical because Our Lord never lets us be tempted beyond our power to resist.

Do I dare say "Lord, I'm only human.?" He has every right to reply "But you have my Spirit living in you! You are not calling on Him.

You have the capacity to be superhuman, because of divine grace inside you."

Only then do I wake up to the truth. Only then can I not only admire the Canaanite woman but also act like her. Having humility and bravery when asking God's help. Here is a pertinent thought from the poet Nancy Spiegelberg:

"Lord I crawled across the barrenness to you with my empty cup. Uncertain in asking any small drop of refreshment. If only I had known you better I'd have come running with a bucket."

God love you always and give you His peace.

"In the lesson of the Samaritan woman we have an example of how a lay person may do the work of an apostle. The Samaritan woman met Jesus and listened to a long instruction from Him. This instruction was the mans of her conversion, and of such a conversion that she wanted to do all she could for Jesus. In her eagerness to carry His message to others she left her water pot behind her, showing that she was detached from all things. She who had led people away from God, now led them back to Him when she knew the truth. We have known the truth for a long time; did it make us apostles? Did it make us forget all things, like the water pot?"

Jesus, Messiah, like the Samaritan woman, please help me to be able to share how you have acted in my life. Give me the courage to say to someone else, "This is how I was..." Then I encountered Christ. Now this is how I am..." Amen.
