

Make sure you are an Active Parishioner.

To receive a letter of Sponsorship for Baptism or Confirmation from the Pastor, one has to be an active parishioner of this parish for at least six months, be of age, received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist), and if married, be in a valid Roman Catholic Church recognized marriage. The Partnering Parishes of St. Charles Borromeo Church, Drexel Hill, and Sacred Heart Church, Clifton Heights, defines an "active/participating" parishioner as one who is registered and worshipping at this parish on a regular ("weekly") basis; and who supports the parish with their time, talent and treasure.

Dear Church Family:

Today is the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. What is Ordinary Time? With the Baptism of the Lord the Christmas Season comes to an end. "Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Time" (Universal Norms, 43). In the Church's liturgical Year, Ordinary Times began on Monday, January 13 and continues until the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday on March 5th leading us to Easter Sunday, April 20th and the seven weeks of the Easter Season. Ordinary Times resume after Pentecost until Sunday, November 23, 2025

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY, January 18th to January 25th is a wonderful opportunity to redouble our efforts to think and pray in a wider sense of what Our Lord Himself prayed for at the Last Supper, that they all may be one. Let's be more conscience and intentional in offering prayers that all Christians may pray for greater unity as we collaborate on the works of mercy for those most in need.

JANUARY 22 – A SPECIAL DAY OF PRAYER THROUGHOUT THE DIOCESES OF THE U.S.A. "As we celebrate this Jubilee Year as *Pilgrims of Hope*, Pope Francis invites us to experience God's love 'that awakens in hearts the sure hope of salvation in Christ," said Bishop Daniel E. Thomas of Toledo. As chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, Bishop Thomas offered the following reflection on the 52nd anniversary of the decision by the Supreme Court of the United States in *Roe v. Wade* that legalized abortion nationwide: "I join all Catholics throughout our nation in observing January 22 as a day of prayer and penance. As we prayerfully continue the essential work of restoring full legal protection of all preborn children and supporting parents facing difficult pregnancies, we also recognize our need for asking forgiveness and healing from the Lord for when we have given in to the culture of death.

"Abortion inflicts deep and lasting wounds on society, but more directly on individuals and families. Many mothers and fathers may feel they have no choice except abortion. Some are pressured or coerced. No matter the circumstances of the abortion, we must recognize the often-silent grief of parents for their child and their despair of being worthy of the love and forgiveness of God and others.

"To the parents of children who have died by abortion, I am deeply sorry for your loss. Know that our Lord loves you as His daughters and sons no matter your actions. No sin is beyond His unfathomable Mercy. Jesus greatly desires our repentant hearts and invites us into an encounter with Him. For Catholics, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is always available for those seeking God's forgiveness, hope, and peace.

"As we celebrate this Jubilee Year as *Pilgrims of Hope*, Pope Francis invites us to experience God's love 'that awakens in hearts the sure hope of salvation in Christ' (*Spes Non Confundit*, 6). Hope allows those who have been involved in abortion to turn to God and repent, confident that He will forgive and make them whole.

"This January 22 and beyond, we need to be reassured that Jesus Himself, who is the source of our hope, was first wounded for our offenses, and suffered for every sin of ours, including abortion. Please join me in praying that God will fill the hearts of mothers and fathers suffering the emotional and psychological wounds from abortion with the hope of forgiveness that only He can give. We invite them to seek support from the Church's compassionate and confidential ministries."
