

Fast and Abstinence

The Bishops of the US prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are **14 years of age and older** are bound to abstain from eating meat on *Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.* Further, all persons **18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday,** are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

In this collection are resources to help the faithful deepen their understanding of various Lenten days, practices, and devotions. You can find resources on prayer, the mystery of Christ's Passion, the roots of Holy Week found in Judaism, and many things to help guide the faithful through the holiest days in our liturgical year—the Triduum. We pray that all of these resources draw us deeper into the mystery of Lent, Holy Week, and the Triduum.

The Second Week of Lent

We continue the first part of Lent, during which we learn, along with those preparing for Baptism, wonderful lessons in our faith. We can feel the rhythm developing. Sunday is always our celebration of the Lord's resurrection, and establishes our theme for the week. Wednesdays and Fridays remind us of our commitment to a change of heart. Monday, Tuesday and Thursday reintroduce us to wonderful scriptures for our journey. Saturday is always uplifting and joyful. The Opening Prayer of the Liturgy each day continues to guide our prayer. As we experience how simple these prayers are, and how easy they are to make our own, we find ourselves praying together in the same Spirit, with one another on this journey, around the world.

Lenten Patterns: Eating

Lent is a great time to change our eating patterns. This is not about "losing weight" or "getting in shape," though for most of us, paying attention to what we eat, will make a difference in our overall health. This is about being more alert. Anyone who has tried to diet knows that something changes in us when we try to avoid eating. The whole purpose of fasting is to aid prayer - to make it easier to listen to God more openly, especially in times of need. The other powerful advantage of fasting is that it can be a very simple gesture that puts us in greater solidarity with the poor of the earth, who often have very little more than a little rice and beans each day. Powerful things happen, when we think about those people in the world who have so much less than we do. And, it's a great cure for self-pity.

Dear Church Family,

Each year on Holy Saturday during the Easter Vigil, thousands are baptized into the Catholic Church in the United States. Parishes welcome these new Catholics through the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*. We have been meeting with three individuals over the last year to help them discern their call from God to walk with us as members of the Roman Catholic Church. One of the three is Robert, who is our Catechumen.

Each of them has come with some knowledge of Jesus Christ, and has considered his or her relationship with Jesus Christ, somehow experiencing an attraction to the Catholic Church. This period is known as the **Period of Evangelization and Precatechumenate**.

The **Period of the Catechumenate** can last for as long as several years or for a shorter time. It depends on how the person is growing in faith, what questions they encounter along the way, and how God leads them on this journey. During this time, the Catechumens consider what God is saying to them in the Scriptures, what changes in their life they need to make to respond to God's inspiration, and what Baptism in the Catholic Church means. When a Catechumen and the priest and the parish team working with him or her believes the person is ready to make a faith commitment to Jesus in the Catholic Church, the next step is the request for baptism and the celebration of the Rite of Election. Even before the Catechumens are baptized, they have a special relationship to the Church.

Last Saturday afternoon, March 8th, the Vigil of the First Sunday of Lent, The Rite of Election took place at the Cathedral-Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The Rite included the enrollment of names of all the Catechumens seeking baptism at the coming Easter Vigil and the names of those Candidates seeking Full Communion in the Church. The Catechumens and the Candidates, their sponsors and families gathered to publicly express their desire for baptism and to receive the Easter Sacraments to the diocesan bishop. Their names of the Catechumens are recorded in a book and they are called the Elect.

These days of Lent are the final **Period of Purification and Enlightenment** leading up to the Easter Vigil. Let's join in praying for Robert, Christina and Sandra. May this Lent be a period of preparation marked by prayer, study, and spiritual direction for the Elect, and our Candidates as we hold them in prayer. During the Easter Vigil this Holy Saturday, Robert, as our Elect, will receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, becoming fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

What is meant by reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church?

Christina, and Sandra are our Candidates for Reception into Full Communion with the Catholic Church. Reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church describes the process for entrance into the Catholic Church for already baptized Christians. Christina and Sandra are seeking Reception. They will make a profession of faith (since they are already baptized). To prepare for this reception, the people, who are called Candidates, usually participate in a formation program to help them understand and experience the teachings and practices of the Catholic Church. Although some preparation may be with Catechumens preparing for baptism, the preparation for Candidates is different since they have already been baptized and committed to Jesus Christ, and many have also been active members of other Christian communities. The Candidates may be received into the Catholic Church at any time, and in the Easter Season.

Let us continue to make a good Lent leading to Easter joy!
