

We are collecting only "new" (not used) infants clothing for new born babies. Please place your donations in the <u>bassinet in the back of church near the confessionals.</u> We are starting **Sunday**, **May 14** and ending **Sunday**, **May 28**.

"Mothers' Home was founded in 1991 as a shelter for homeless, pregnant women in need of a safe and stable environment to prepare for childbirth. Fortunately, the empty convent on the Blessed Virgin Mary campus in Darby was available. During the time the BVM site was being renovated, the young women lived in a large home in Lansdowne. The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent

and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the <u>Month of May</u>, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

An Act of Consecration

to the Blessed Virgin Mary Holy Mary, Mother of God and Virgin, I choose thee this day for my queen, patron, and advocate, and firmly resolve and purpose never to abandon thee, never to say or do anything against thee, nor to permit that aught be done by others to dishonor thee. Receive me, then, I conjure thee, as thy perpetual servant; assist me in all my actions, and do not abandon me at the hour of my death. Amen. — St. John Berchmans

Sixth Sunday Of Easter

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

"Sounds like a plan." We say it when we have mutual agreement on some future action. Implied is our trust in the "other" to honor the idea with more than words. So two reputations are at stake, yours and theirs. Trust is on the line. Of course, that trust is in jeopardy if one or the other party reneges. There comes trouble.

Through our Baptism, you and I lay claim to love Jesus Christ as Our Lord and God, specifically in this Easter season as our risen Lord and Redeemer. Today we hear Him tell His closest devotees that He will soon be leaving them. But He will not leave them to their own resources. He will send them an Advocate, whom we know as the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Holy Trinity. He will provide an action plan.

To preclude any breaking of the bond that they have forged between them over the past three years, Jesus tells His Apostles and disciples of His love for them. So a question arises: How will this love be manifest? How will they retain what He gives them? The answer is a plan: by their observance of His commandments. Implied here is not only the ancient Ten, but also the more recently proclaimed Eight Beatitudes. In other words, a "Christian Plan of Action."

Easy enough to understand. Tough as nails to keep. And oh how we know that to be true! Especially when we leave Sunday Mass, only to tackle a whole new week of daily life out there in the so-called "real world," beginning with the parking lot.

But listen again, everybody, to the encouragement we receive from the God Man who became like us in all things but sin: "Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves Me. And whoever loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

Of course, keeping our promise takes perseverance. Who best to remind us of that than Mary our heavenly Mother, and the woman we all honor on this Mother's Day?

They might even tell us this story about perseverance and a certain frog:

Two frogs fell into a can of cream, or so I've heard it told.

The sides of the can were shiny and steep. The cream was deep and cold.

"Oh, what's the use?" croaked number one. "'Tis fate, no help's around.

Good-bye, my friend! Good-bye sad world!" And weeping still, he drowned.

But frog number two, of sterner stuff, dog-paddled in surprise,

The while he wiped his creamy face and dried his creamy eyes.

"I'll swim a while, at least," he said. Or so I've heard he said.

"It really wouldn't help the world if one more frog were dead."

An hour or two he kicked and swam. Not once he stopped to mutter,

But kicked and kicked and swam and kicked. Then hopped out by way of butter!

God love you and give you His Easter peace.

Finally, draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil. For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principal-

ities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens. Therefore, put on the armor of God, that you may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold your ground. So stand fast with your loins girded in truth, clothed with righteousness as a breastplate, and your feet shod in readiness for the gospel of peace. In all circumstances, hold faith as a shield, to quench all [the] flaming arrows of the evil one. And take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Amen. (Ephesians 6:10-17)


