### 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

You need a license these days for so many things. That includes one for driving a car, truck, or bus. For hunting game, fishing for fish, or carrying a pistol, and for so many more of life's activities. Attached along with the license are bunches of regulations and penalties for ignoring them. But one doesn't need a license for practicing hypocrisy.

As truth itself, Our Lord was rightly repulsed by any instance of this, especially when He found it among religious leaders of His people. Today He offers a withering critique of the scribes and Pharisees for their hypocrisy.

On another occasion, He had called them "blind guides."

Today He urges the people in His audience to observe what they teach, but not how they acted. Why? Because "they preach but they do not practice."

I am at once sorry and ashamed upon pondering those words at the behavior of some of my brother priests who deserve that same rebuke. They brought great harm to many people, especially among the young, by their abuse of them. It remains an ongoing scandal. The late Benedict XVI succinctly described it as "filth" within the Church. It remains one of the devil's most successful efforts to harm the Church.

But today we hear Our Lord speak so powerfully about hypocrisy that could dwell in you and me. His assessment requires introspection on our parts. Have we, in some way or other, "preached" but not practiced? Have we given the young and not-so-young among us the kind of bad example that threatens their respect and love for the teachings of Christ and His Church? I think we do when we neglect our participation at the Mass, or we speak negatively about the pope or our pastor, who are our spiritual leaders. Our choice of TV shows. Our often-crude language. All habits that invite the young to imitate.

Our Lord offers a remedy; be humble. Recognize that true fidelity to God is shown by service of Him, followed by service to other people. Above all, to practice what you "preach" by your lifestyle.

A father once complained about the amount of time his family spent watching television. His children watched cartoons and neglected schoolwork. His wife preferred soap operas to housework. His solution?

"As soon as football season's over, I'm going to pull the plug."

God love you and give you His peace.

#### Say The Word

"They talked a lot about the love of the Father for you as His beloved daughter. I just felt very strongly that He loves me in a special way. I already knew that, but it was just so strongly reinforced." "We must let ourselves be loved. The feminine heart has the capacity to be open for total surrender to God. He will then overshadow us and His love will fill us and it will flow from us to others." "One of the speakers talked about the lame man at the pool of Bethesda who had been unable to walk for 38 years. When Jesus asked him if he wanted to be healed, he made excuses. She said, 'If Jesus asks you, "Do you want to be healed?" don't make excuses or ask Him to heal someone else. Let yourself be healed." "It was encouraging to see the Shrine full of faith-filled women."

These were some of the takeaway messages our catechists received at the Catholic Women's Conference at Our Lady of Czestochowa Shrine last weekend. It was beautiful how we each heard God speaking to our hearts. This is essential for us to be able to pass on the faith. Our hearts are like a reservoir - we need to be continually filled with the love and presence of God so that we can share that message with others. Are you taking opportunities to receive God's grace in your life?

#### Call to Holiness

We entered the month of November celebrating All Saints Day (1st), and then recalling All the Faithful Departed (2nd) whom we commend to God's mercy, so they may rest in His peace.

In these challenging and troubled times, we need to bring our faith into our world. As the Second Vatican Council teaches, "...that all the faithful of Christ of whatever rank or status, are called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity; by this holiness as such a more human manner of living is promoted in this earthly society." The Council goes on to say that "They must follow in His footsteps and conform themselves to His image seeking the will of the Father in all things. They must devote themselves with all their being to the glory of God and the service of their neighbor. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will grow into an abundant harvest of good, as is admirably shown by the life of so many saints in Church history" (1964 Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, Lumen Gentium, Chapter 5, par 40).

**Pierogi Fundraiser:** Unfortunately, we are not able to have our Pierogi Fundraiser this Fall, our main coordinators, Joanne and Gene Bidoli are experiencing serious health issues at this time. We agreed that it is more important for them to attend to their health. Let's keep them in prayer!

**Vote on Tuesday:** It is our right and duty to elect those men and women who represent us in local, state, and federal government. We need to know the candidates and their platforms, weigh the issues and vote according to our conscience properly formed by the judgement of reason, the Word of God, the divine law, and the teachings of the Church.

**Parents:** Parents and Guardians, please lead and guide your children. Practice your faith, teach and pass it on to them as you shape their hearts for heaven by your good example and witness to love God and neighbor, as we love ourselves.

**Young Disciples**: Our youth still need formation in the Catholic faith and a Christian way of life. We are trying to find ways to help them stay close to their Catholic faith, develop peer relationships, experience the beauty of our Catholic worship, and grow in a contagious joy through Christ-like service to others. There is a meeting on Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup> at St. Charles Parish Hall at 1pm for anyone who desires to help our youth. Come and volunteer.

**St. Hedwig Church**: The faithful parishioners of St. Hedwig Church (averaging about 25-30 people) coming to the one Mass each Sunday morning are very spirited and dedicated in their very generous support of their Church through the years. They are a small community of believers that enjoys celebrating their Polish heritage and customs. Despite their best efforts, declining attendance, and declining revenues, along with increased costs to maintain the facilities are no longer sustainable for them.

So, having brought these matters before the people of St. Hedwig Church, and having consulted with the Parish Financial Council of Sacred Heart, and the Parish Pastoral Council of the Partnering Parishes of Sacred Heart and St. Charles Borromeo, as well as with Reverend Thomas P. Whittingham, our Dean, and the Office for Parish Service and Support, I have written to Archbishop Nelson J. Perez and recommended that Saint Hedwig Church be officially closed, with the very last Mass taking place on Sunday, December 31, 2023.
